

Reflecting on your Testimony

The following are questions to consider when writing your testimony. You will not include all this information when writing your testimony, but you may find it helpful in putting together a spiritual timeline. The questions will mainly assist you in reflecting on all the ways that God's hand has been evidenced in your life from the beginning to the present time. The questions were taken from Beth Moore's Believing God study.

1. What, if any, is your spiritual heritage from your great-grandparents forward?
2. Who, if any, among your extended family members had the most impact on early seeds of Christian belief planted in your life?
3. Were you exposed to any religious education through church or school growing up? Describe the way you view it in retrospect.
4. Who, if anyone, outside your extended family had the most influence on you spiritually during your childhood? Explain how.
5. How would you characterize your home life growing up?
6. When did you receive Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior? Describe the specifics of what happened.
7. Since becoming a Christian, list people who God has used to impact your life. Explain how.
8. Can you think of any lies that you have believed that God later exposed you to and replaced with truth? If so, please explain.
9. Note any major or pivotal events that have happened throughout your life. How did they influence your life? Make sure you also note the approximate dates and locations of these events. Remember both the blessings and challenges. Think about how each of these was used to draw you into a deeper relationship with God.
10. What is God currently teaching you about?
